This Indenture made and entered into the 28th day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty five between Dempsey Blythe and his wife of the one part and Anthony M. Howell of the other part, Witnesseth that for and in consideration of two hundred and seventy-five dollars current money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said Anthony M. Howell, the said Dempsey Blythe and his wife have bargained and sold unto the said Anthony M. Howell, they, his heirs and assigns one certain tract or parcel of land containing, by estimation seven ty-five acres be the same more or less, being the tract formerly purchased by Dempsey Blythe of the aforesaid Howell and bounded as follows, beginning at a Survey monument thence by a line of marked trees to a corner tree in the branch, thence up the branch to a short gum thence by a line of marked trees to a corner pine thence by a line of marked trees to Baldy Drakes corner to a red oak Ridley Drakes corner thence to a corner tree and thence to the beginning and the reserved and various, remainder and various, partly and other parts, issues and profits and every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold said tract of land with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular the promises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold with every part and parcel thereof with every of their right members and appurtenances unto him the said Anthony M. Howell his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Dempsey Blythe and his wife for themselves and their heirs the said tract of land with all and singular the promises and appurtenances herein before mentioned unto the said Anthony M. Howell his heirs and assigns forever free from the claim of them the said Dempsey Blythe and his wife or either of them or their heirs or any person claiming under them. Witnesseth that the said Martha Broadshaw for and in consideration of the sum of seventy five dollars which said sum is due from the said Martha Broadshaw to the said James Clayton by bond bearing date the 7th day of October 1829, as well as all other monies which may now be owing from the said Martha Broadshaw to the said James Clayton by means of any dealing, transfer of note or paper whatever, as also for and in consideration of the dollar to her in hand paid by the said William Stephenson, the receipt whereof the said Martha Broadshaw doth hereby acknowledge, hath granted bargained and sold unto the said William Stephenson and his heirs forever, all her right and interest in the following property to wit one Cow of yearling, seventeen head of hogs, two Earthen Ware
