 right and interest of the said Martha Broadshaw herein conveyed or intended to be conveyed
 unto her the said Milburn Stephenson his heirs and assigns forever, upon this special trust
 and condition that the said Milburn Stephenson upon being thereto required by the aforesaid
 James Clayton shall proceed to sell all the right and interest of the said Martha
 Broadshaw to the above named property conveyed or intended to be conveyed, after advertising,
 at the time and place in the County of Southampton for ten days previous at some public house
 or store for cash and out of the money arising out of the said sale in the first place
 pay and satisfy all cost attending the said sale as well as the expenses attending the said
 conveyance and then pay off the bond aforesaid with interest as well as all other monies
 which may appear to be due and owing from the said Martha Broadshaw to the said James
 Clayton by means of any dealing, transfer of debts or paper whatsoever and the surplus if any
 pay to the said Martha Broadshaw. And the said Martha Broadshaw for herself her heirs
 executors and administrators the right and title of the said property herein conveyed unto the
 said Milburn Stephenson his heirs and assigns forever with herby command and assent against
 the lawful claims of her the said Martha Broadshaw her heirs executors and administra-
 tors and against all and every other person or persons whomsoever. And the said Mil-
 burn Stephenson on his part covenants and agrees that he will make sale of the right
 and interest hereby conveyed for the best prices he can obtain for the same, after adver-
 tising the time and place for ten days previous at some public house or store in the said County
 and with the monies arising from the sale first pay and satisfy all cost attending the same
 as well as the expenses attending the conveyance and then pay off the aforesaid bond and inter-
 est as well as all other monies which may appear to the said James Clayton to be justly due
 and owing from the said Martha Broadshaw to the James Clayton by means of any dealing,
 transfer of debts or paper whatsoever and then pay the overplus if any to the said Martha
 Broadshaw, and the said Milburn Stephenson on his part covenants and agrees that he will re-
 lease the said Martha Broadshaw from the obligation of this incumbrance upon the said Martha
 Broadshaw paying him the amount of the aforesaid bond with interest as well as all other
 monies which may be due and owing to him from the said Martha Broadshaw by means
