This Indenture made the 32nd day of November in the year 1835 between Barwell Jones his wife of the one part and George Blunt of the other part, Northfolk, that the said Barwell Jones & Dicy Jones his wife, in consideration of the sum of two hundred and sixty dollars lawful money of this Commonwealth, is then in hand paid by the said George Blunt at and before the making and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, unto the said George Blunt his heirs and assigns, a certain tract of Lands containing thirty-one acres bounded on the North by the land of Montpelier, on the east by that of Henry Ed. of Benjmn. Blunt also, with all the appurtenances belonging to said land, and the revenues and profits thereof, to have and to hold the said tract of Lands, with the tenements, hereditaments, and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be hereinafter sold, and every part and parcel thereof with every of their rights, members and appurtenances unto the said George Blunt his heirs and assigns forever, to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said George Blunt his assigns and heirs forever, and the said Barwell Jones and Dicy Jones his wife for themselves and their heirs, the said land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned, unto the said George Blunt his heirs and assigns free from the claims and claims of them, the said Barwell Jones, and his wife Dicy Jones or either of them, their or either of their heirs and of all and of every person or persons whatsoever, shall, with and as warrant and forever defense by these presents. In Witness whereof, the said Barwell Jones and Dicy Jones his wife have hereunto set their hands and seals this the 32nd day of November 1835.
