 and the said Abigail Broadshaw & Martha his wife for themselves and their heirs forever
 land here mentioned, unto the said Isaac Holt his heirs and assigns forever from the claims
 of them the said Abigail Broadshaw & Martha his wife or either of them or their
 heirs and of all and every other person or persons whatsoever, shall and will remain and
