

it being the said Albridgeon Bradshaw's undivided interest in thirty-one acres of land which his father William Bradshaw did survey and proposed of, being one fifth of the same, there being five legacies being six and one-half acres more of less and bounded by the lands of William Bradshaw, Deion Bradshaw and Black Creek together with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging, or in any wise appertaining to the same or any part thereof and the inclosure and reversion, remained, and remainders, issues and profits hereof, with every foot and parcel thereof, to have and to hold the said manors, tenements, gardens, water and water courses to the said lands belonging, or in any wise appertaining to the same or any part or parcel thereof, unto the said Drew Holt his heirs and assigns forever; and the said Albridgeon Bradshaw & Martha his wife for themselves and their heirs before mentioned, unto the said Drew Holt his heirs and assigns from from the claim of them the said Albridgeon Bradshaw & Martha his wife or others of them or their heirs and of all and every other person or persons whatever, shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents. This Indenture made this 10th day of December One thousand eight hundred and thirty five, between Joshua Doyal and Emma his wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and William Harris of the other part, witnesseth that the said Joshua Doyal and Emma his wife for and on the consideration of the sum of twenty five dollars gold and lawful money of Virginia in hand paid by the said William Harris the receipt whereof the said Joshua Doyal and Emma his wife acknowledge, let granted bargained and sold unto the said William Harris a certain tract of land of several acres wherein Samuel Griffin formerly lived containing thirty-five acres be the same less or less together with all demesne Doyals and his wife's interest in the same since that Elizabeth Mills holds of Willis Turner's Lands and bounded by the lines of the said
