

Deed to Jesse Parker

sole alien, enfeoffed and confirmed, and by these presents do and each of them  
with grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff and confirm unto him the said Jesse Parker  
his heirs and assigns forever, all that portion, lot or lots of lands which  
was assigned to them the said Jacob and Seth Williams as their portion of  
the lands of which their grandfather Jordan Williams dec'd. did seize and  
possess in the aforesaid County of Southampton and which on a plat of the  
lands of said Jordan Williams dec'd. taken for the purpose of distributing the same  
under a decree of the said County Court aforesaid amongst the heirs bearing date  
January 18<sup>th</sup> 1716 is marked No. 14, unto him in two separate lots, by one lying  
on the bedar Swamp & bounded as follows: Beginning at the corner of lot No. 3 as  
marked on the aforesaid plat, in Jesse Parker's (late Richmond Dillards) Mill pond,  
running thence down the mill pond to the Mill; thence along the boundaries of  
an acre of lands attached to the mill; to the Mill race, or near the run of the Great Swamp  
above there down st. Swamp to a large log pole a corner on the late Jacob Dardens line to a post oak  
thence a straight line N. 13° East to the beginning  
containing thirty six acres & one rood, be the same more or less. The other lot lying on the  
road leading to Jones ferry, and bounded as follows: Beginning at a stake a corner of said  
Dardens land, at the fence side, in the edge of said road, running thence a straight  
line S. 22° W. to the line of the late Abram Mitchells land; running thence along said  
line to Alexander Booths line, thence along Booths line to a corner red oak, standing  
on the side of said road, thence along said road the several courses thereof to the begin-  
ning, containing sixty eight acres & two roods: making in all one hundred and four acres  
& three roods, be the same more or less: It being the same lots or parcels of lands conveyed  
by Jacob Dardens the Guardian of the said Jacob & Seth Williams to Jesse Parker aforesaid, by  
a deed of bargain and sale, bearing date the 18<sup>th</sup> day of March 1716 as will appear  
by reference to records in the Clerks Office of Southampton County. The object of the present was  
being to confirm and make good what was done by the aforesaid Guardian, and give their con-  
tention to the act of the Guardians. To have and to hold the said lots or parcels of  
grounds together with all and singular the rents, issues and profits, emoluments and appur-  
tenances to the same belonging, or in any wise appertaining, to him the said Jesse Parker his  
heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims of them the said Jacob Williams & Seth Wil-  
liams or either of them their or either of their heirs and of all and every person or per-  
sons what soever, they the said Jacob & Seth Williams, shall, will and do warrant and  
forever defend by these presents. In witness whereof the said Jacob Williams & Seth Wil-  
liams have hereunto set their hands and seals the day any year as first above written.
