and bounded as follows; beginning, at a black Gum in a small branch, thence up said branch
the various courses 134 poles to the fork at another, thence down the other branch, binding on
Henry Thomas' old line the various courses 203 poles to a corner white oak thence south west as
to Thomas (lying and being in the County of Southampton on the south side of Nottoway
River) containing by estimation two hundred and twenty three acres more or less and bounded
as follows; beginning, at a small white oak standing in Hooks Spring, thence along a line
of marked trees to a gum a corner tree of John Thomas, and Henry Thomas' line in the
head of a small branch thence down the said branch to a large white oak, thence a
line of marked trees to a great branch, thence down the said branch to Thomas
thence down, thence down the said swamp to the mouth of the Deep Branch, thence
up the said branch to the beginning. And also another tract (see Thomas to Thompson)
containing by estimation four acres more or less lying and being in the County of South-
ampton on the North side of John Thomas' tract and bounded as follows; beginning,
at a white oak in a small branch in John Thomas' line, thence along a line of
marked trees in the old line, between the said Newson and Thomas nearly north to the
great branch, thence up the said branch to a small branch up the said branch to the be-
ginning (5 acres more or less) the several tracts above referred to make up the landed Estate
of N. Barcoheart Thompson (600 acres more or less) and are conveyed to Anne Stephenson by
N. Barcoheart Thompson upon the terms here to be mentioned to be held by him his heirs and
assigns in fee forever free from any claim or claim whatever of any nature either in reversion
remainder or otherwise and which title without defect and free from the claim of all per-
