Know all men by these presents that we Benjamin Griffin Samuel B. Jones Esquires
here and firmly bound unto Lilliaton M. Tazewell Esq. Governor of the Commonwealth of
Virginia in the just and full sum of Thirty thousand dollars to be paid to the said Governor
and his successors for the use of the said Commonwealth, for the payment whereof well and
truly to be made, we bind ourselves and each of us our and each of our heirs executors and ad-
ministrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents, Sealed with our seals and dated the
18 day of January 1836

The condition of the above obligation is such that whereas the above bound Benjamin
Griffin is constituted and appointed Sheriff of the County of Southampton by a Commission
from the Governor under the seal of the Commonwealth dated the — day of December
last past to continue in Office until the first quarterly term of the Court of the County
for the year 1837. If therefore the said Benjamin Griffin, shall truly and faithfully
collect account for and pay the taxes imposed by law, and arrears of taxes due in the
County of Southampton and shall truly and faithfully collect account for and pay the
militia fines imposed by law and arrears of militia fines due in his said County
of Southampton then the above obligation shall be void; otherwise to remain in full force and
virtue

said Governor and his successors for the use of the said Commonwealth, we bind ourselves
our heirs Executors Administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents sealed with
our seals and dated the 18th day of January 1836

The condition of the above obligation is such, that whereas the above bound Mills
Sumner has been duly appointed by the Court of Southampton County, to serve as Constable
within the said County until July past 1837 to fill the vacancy occasioned by the resignation of
David Savage. Now, if the said Mills Sumner shall well and truly discharge the duties
of the said office of Constable in said County during his continuance therein, then this obli-
gation to be void or else to remain in full force and virtue.
