This Indenture made this 3rd day of Decr. in the year of our Lord one thousand
and eight hundred and thirty-five between James Drury and Mary Ann his wife formerly
Mary Ann Myrick of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part
and John Drury of the said County aforesaid of the other part. Whereas that for and in
consideration of the sum of three thousand dollars, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
by the said James and Mary Ann (his wife) hath granted bargained and sold and by
these presents do grant bargain sell and conform unto the said John Drury one certain
tract or parcel of land lying in the County of Southampton and bounded on the east
by the lands of John Shepherd or Exton P. Claude, on the north by the lands of James
Drury on the West by the lands bequeathed Francis Clements by Joseph Harris and on
south by the Neheron River containing six hundred and fifty acres, it to be same more or
less and to appear more fall. It is the tract or parcel of land which David Myrick did
buy and possessed of, which there are four hundred and thirty seven acres in the possession
of the said James Drury and the remainder in the possession of James Myrick who in-
tended to leave the same to his wife Mary Ann Myrick which is to be held as such property dur-
ing the life of said David Myrick which said four hundred and thirty seven acres of land
with all the benefits and improvements thereunto belonging we the said James and Mary Ann do
covenant and forever release the right and title unto the said John Drury his heirs or assigns
for ever, together with all our right and title so remainder more or necessary or any other claim
which we have, or may have in the above named above land. In witness whereof we the
said James Drury and Mary Ann, have hereunto set our hand and affixed our seals this
