This Indenture made the 19th day of January 1836 between George Blunt of the one part and Richard Darden of the other part both of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia: Witnesseth that the said George Blunt for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred and sixty-five dollars lawful money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Richard Darden (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) he the said George Blunt hath granted bargained and sold, and he thereunto well and lawfully consented and sell unto the said Richard Darden a certain tract of land containing thirty one acres, bounded on the North by the lands of William Pope, on the East by that of Benjamin Cawaras formerly, on the South by that of Benjamin Blunt's and on the West by the land of Benjamin Blunt's also, it being, the land lately purchased by the said George Blunt of Burwell Jones & Wife, with all the appurtenances belonging to said land, and the reversions and reversioners, remainder and remainders, yearly and other rents (free and profits thereof) and of every part and parcel thereof. He have and to hold the said tract of land with the tenements, hereditaments and all and singular other the premises and appurtenances unto the said Richard Darden his heirs and assigns forever. And the said George Blunt for himself and his heirs and assigns, to the said Richard Darden his heirs and assigns forever with hereby warrant and forever defend the title of the said land. In witness whereof the said George Blunt hath hereunto set his his hand and affixed his seal the day and year first within written.
