This Indenture made and entered this twenty first day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty six between Albert Andrews and Sally his wife of the County of Southampton of the first part and Henry Ellis of the County of Sussex of the second part and Thomas S. Drumwright of the third part. Witnesseth that the said Albert Andrews and Sally his Wife being justly indebted to the said Henry Ellis and desirous to secure to the payment of the same debt for themselves their heirs and assigns grant bargain and sell unto the said Henry Ellis his heirs or assigns the following property to wit one tract of Land on which he now lives containing fifty acres two feather beds and furniture, two Cows, one mare and colt, some hogs horse hola and kitchen furniture of iron and fodder, it being to secure the payment of the sum of \$100 due by note and accounts and if the said Albert Andrews and Sally his Wife should not will and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Henry Ellis his heirs or assigns the above named sum of \$100, the said Thomas S. Drumwright shall after being legally notified by the said Henry Ellis his heirs or assigns advertise and sell for cash after giving ten day's notice, all the said property or so much thereof as will satisfy the above named sum of \$100 with such cost and commissions. The balance, if any, pay unto the said Albert Andrews and Sally his wife, their heirs or assigns. But if the said Albert Andrews and Sally his wife shall will and truly pay the above named sum of \$100 then this obligation shall be void, if not to remain in full force and effect.
