This Indenture made the 23<sup>d</sup> day of January in the year eighteen hundred and thirty-six,  
between James Garver and Lilly his wife of the County of Southampton, of the one part and Richd  
A. Baker, of the County of Hampshire of the other part. Whereas the said James Garver  
and Lilly his wife for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred and thirty one dollars and  
several rents to them in hand paid by the said Richard A. Baker at or before the concluding  
and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, they the said James Garver  
and Lilly his wife, have granted, bargained and sold and by these presents do and each of them  
doth grant, bargain and sell unto the said Richard A. Baker his heirs and assigns, a certain  
tract of Land lying & being in the County of Southampton, situated on Blackwater  
River and bounded as follows; beginning at a pine at corner of Caum Jinkins standing on the  
River bank, thence up the said river the several courses thereof 42 poles to a topsoil on the  
River bank; thence south 85° West 190 poles to a small slave wood near a marsh  
at the late Peter Moores line, thence along said Moore's line south 10° East 117 poles to  
a pine at corner on said Moores line, thence south 63 East 118 poles to a red oak a corner  
of Caum Jinkins, thence North 35 East 152 poles to the beginning, containing one hundred and
