Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of three thousand five hundred dollars, the receipt whereof is fully acknowledged by the sa. John Devery hath granted, bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain & sell unto the sa. James Devery his heirs & assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the aforesaid County and bounded as follows on the east by the lands of Calvin B. Blair, James Myrick and the lands lately purchased by the said James Devery of John Ship, on the North by the lands of Sterling Ship on the West by the lands of Frances (un-), on the South by the lands of the Meherrin River containing six hundred acres, it to be the same, more or less, and to appear more fully, it is the same tract or parcel of land sold by the said James Devery to the said John Devery some time in the year Eighteen hundred and thirty-five together with all the improvements and benefits thereunto belonging, to have and to hold unto the said James Devery his heirs & assigns forever, which said lands of the said John Devery, do warrant and forever defend the right and title unto the sa. James Devery his heirs and assigns forever against the claims or claims of any person or persons whatsoever. To have and to hold, possess and enjoy the said tract or parcel of land and premises, with the appurtenances unto the said John Prince his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and behoof of him the said John Prince his heirs and assigns forever. And the said William Prince Jr. and Martha A. his Wife, for themselves and their heirs the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises to the said John Prince his heirs and assigns against themselves and their heirs and against all and every person or persons whatsoever shall and well warrant and by these presents
