Thence to a line on the South edge of said Rail Road, fifty feet from the center of said Rail Road, thence along a line parallel to, and fifty feet from the center of said Rail Road, north seventy-three degrees east, one hundred and twenty-five poles to a Poplar branch, a corner for Kent's story and in James Story's line, thence along the same Kent's story and line to the aforesaid County Road, thence along the same South nineteen and a half degrees west, forty, eight and a quarter poles to the beginning, together with all right title interest, claim or demand of or to the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises with its appurtenances thereto belonging or in any way appurtenant. To have and to hold, the said tract or parcel of land and premises with all its appurtenances as aforesaid unto the said William T. Mahone, his heirs and assigns forever, to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said William T. Mahone, his heirs and assigns forever; and the said William Wick for himself, his heirs and assigns and administrators with hereby covenant and agree to and with the said William T. Mahone, his heirs and assigns and administrators and assigns that he the said William Wick will by these presents warrant and forever defend the right and title of the aforesaid tract or parcel of land & premises and every part or parcel thereof, against the claim or demands of all and every persons or persons whatsoever. This Indenture made and entered into on the 20th day of December in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty four between Mills N. Nick and Dorothy Nick his Wife, of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part, and Jacob Jordan of the same County and State, of the other part, Witnesses, that the said Mills N. Nick and Dorothy Nick his Wife for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred Dollars, lawful money of this Commonwealth to them in hand by the said Jacob Jordan at or before the writing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, sold, aliened, conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents do and each of them with grant, give, sell, alien, convey and confirm unto him the said Jacob Jordan his heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract or parcel of land and premises situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of Saint Lukes containing by a late survey fifty acres of three fourths (two the same more or less) it being part of lot No. 3 in the division of the land of Isaac Wick and elsewhere the said Mills N. Nick now resides) and bounded as follows to wit
