To have and to hold, the said tract or parcel of land and premises with all its appurtenances as aforesaid unto the said Heeling J. Mahone, his heirs and assigns forever, to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Heeling J. Mahone, he has and assigns forever. And the said Williams Wick for himself, his heirs, executors and administrators with hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Heeling J. Mahone, his heirs, executors and assigns that he the said Williams Wick will by these presents warrant and forever defend the right and title of the aforesaid tract or parcel of land & premises and every part or parcel thereof, against the claim or demands of all and every persons or persons whatsoever. Wick and Dorothy Wick his Wife for and in consideration of the sum of Two hundred Dollars, current money of this Commonwealth to them in hand by the said Jacob Jordan at or before the making and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, sold aliened, conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents do and each of them with good, law, quiet, sole aliened, conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents do and each of them with good, law, quiet, sole, alien, conveyed and conform unto him the said Jacob Jordan his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land and premises situate lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of Saint Lukes containing by a late survey fifty seven and three quarters acres (be the same more or less) it being part of lot No. 10 in the division of the lands of Isaac Caum Wick and elsewhere the said Mills N. Wick now deceased) and bounded as follows to wit
