This Indenture made this twentieth day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six between Jno Drewry Deputy Sheriff of Southampton County of the one part and George Gardner of the County aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth that whereas at a Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery convened and held for Southampton County the thirtieth day of October one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four it was adjudged and awarded that said Jno Drewry deputy Sheriff of this County after giving twenty days notice by advertisement in writing posted up at the front door of the Court house and at one or more public places in the neighbourhood, proceed to sell at public auction the real estate of George Gardner deceased including the reversionary interest in the aforesaid Land allotted to the aforesaid Martha Gardner on a credit of nine months, and the said Jno Drewry deputy Sheriff as aforesaid, after having advertised agreeable to the terms of the said aforesaid on this day proceed to sell at public auction on the premises the interest, 25, which the said Jno Drewry held in a tract of Land of seventy-six acres formerly owned by James Gardner his father and which is now held by the Master of the said James Gardner deceased as his widow, situated in the County of Southampton, when George Gardner became the purchaser, at the sum of Ninety dollars and twenty five cents.
