This Indenture made this twentieth day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six between Jesse Drury Deputy Sheriff of Southampton County of the one part and Calvin Garner of the County aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth that whereas at a Court Superior Court of Law and Chancery continuous and held for Southampton County the twentieth day of October one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five it was adjudged ordered and decreed that said Jesse Drury deputy Sheriff of this County after giving twenty days notice by advertisement in writing posted up, at the front door of the Court house and at one or more public places in the neighborhood, proceed to sell at public auction the real estate of George Garner decd. including the reversionary interest in the above Lands allotted to the said said Mother Garner on a credit of nine months, and the said Jesse Drury deputy Sheriff as aforesaid, after having advertised agreeable to the terms of the said decree, and on this day proceed to sell at public auction on the premises the Interest, 2/5, which the said George Garner held in a tract of Lands of seventy-six acres formerly owned by James Garner his father and which is now held by the Widow of the said James Garner decd. as her dower, situated in the County of Southampton, when Calvin Garner became the purchaser, at the sum of Ninety dollars and twenty five cents.
