Whereas the undersigned Josiah Jelly hath some years ago intermarriage with one Margaret Boykin one of the daughters and legal heirs and devisees of his father David S. Boykin late of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia, by reason whereof he the said Jelly hath become entitled in remainder and reversion to a proportionable share of the several slaves and other estate of the said David S. Boykin as for a life estate; and whereas one of the children of the said David S. Boykin that is to say, Martha Boykin hath departed this life intestate and under the age of twenty-one year, without issue, by reason whereof the said Jelly is entitled to a proportionable share with the other sons and daughters in her estate; and whereas he the said Josiah Jelly hath bargained and sold to one Matthew M. Tadd of the town of Smithfield for the consideration hereinafter mentioned, all the right title, claim interest and demand of him the said Josiah Jelly in law or equity in what manner or way soever obtained, to the slaves and other estate now held by the said Elizabeth Boykin, and the future increase of the females thereof; Now this Indenture made and entered into this 13th day of April one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, between the said Josiah Jelly of the County of Isle of Wight and State of Virginia of the one part & of the said Matthew M. Tadd of the Town of Smithfield, and County aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth, that the said Josiah Jelly for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars to him in hand paid by the said Matthew M. Tadd, at or before the making and delivery of this indenture (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed and by these presents hath granted bargained and sold unto the said Matthew M. Tadd his heirs, assigns, administrators and assigns forever, all the right title, claim interest and demand in right of him the said Josiah Jelly and Margaret, his wife, late Margaret Boykin, either in law or equity, to the slaves and other estate now held by one Elizabeth Boykin widow of David S. Boykin & of which said Elizabeth is residing in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, and the said Josiah Jelly in order to a free and more full conveyance as to the right which he means to convey, declares that he hereby bargains and sells unto the said Matthew M. Tadd all right, title, claim, interest and demand, either in law or equity to all the slaves and to the future increase of the females thereof and to all other estate, real, personal or mixed which the said Elizabeth Boykin holds or is entitled to hold under the laws of Virginia or by virtue of the will of the said David S. Boykin, and to which he the said Josiah Jelly and wife are entitled both from the will of his father David S. Boykin and as heirs, or one of the heirs or distributees of the aforesaid Martha Boykin and who was one of the children of the said David S. Boykin - so that he the said Josiah Jelly is or is said to claim any estate in the said slaves and other estate aforesaid, but the whole of his interest therein
