Morell his heirs and assigns forever and to have Anna Barnes for herself his heirs Executors
and Administrators and assigns to and with the said Lewis Morell his heirs Executors
and Administrators. That she will by these presents warrant and forever defend the right
of her husband against the claims or demands of all and every person or party whatsoever. In
witness whereof the said Anna Barnes hath hereunto set her hand and affixed her seal the
1st day of April 1835.

This Indenture was made by the oaths of Benjamin Brown, Jacob Peter and Thomas
Morell the Testifies thereto and admitted to record. And at a Court held for the County
aforesaid the 18th day of May 1836 the said Indenture was entered upon the proceedings
of the day.

This Indenture made and entered into this 26th day of November 1835, between
Henry Hughes and Elizabeth his wife of the first part, Benjamin Williamson of the second
part and John G. Mason of the third part. Whereas the said Henry Hughes is indebted to
the said Mason by two bonds bearing equal date with these presents, one payable on demand,
with interest from the 25th Inst. 1835 one payable the 25th day of Decr. next, and the other
payable the 25th day of Decr. 1836 each for the payment of four hundred and three dollars
and thirty-three cents, and whereas the said Henry is willing and desirous to secure the
payment of the said three sums of money according to the tenor, and effect of the bonds
aforesaid. This Indenture therefore witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of
one thousand dollars to them in hand paid by the said Benjamin Williamson
of the second part, they said Henry Hughes and Elizabeth his wife have granted, loaned
and sold to the said Benjamin Williamson that tract or parcel of land situate lying and being
in the County of Southampton containing two hundred and forty two acres to the same more or less
as hereinafter set forth or as was from the said Mason & wife to the said Hughes of equal
value and these presents, and the plot of survey thereto annexed. To have and to hold the said
land with its appurtenances to him the said Benjamin Williamson & to his Executors executors
and assigns forever. Upon Trust nevertheless, that the said Henry Hughes is to retain possession
and the use of the said tract of Land, until default shall be made in payment of the said
sums of money above they shall respectively become due and payable, whereupon if on being
recovered by the said John G. Mason his heirs executors or assigns, the said Benjamin Williamson shall
then convey the time and place of sale for his says at some public place in the neighbourhood
of the said tract of Land with its appurtenances, to the highest bidder for cash, and of the proceeds
