thousand eight hundred and thirty six, between Joshua Morton & Matilda his wife of the  
County of Southampton of the one part and William Pona of the same County on the  
other part. Witnesseth that the said Joshua Morton & Matilda his wife for and in consideration  
of the sum of fifteen dollars in hand paid by the said William Pona it and to  
fore the aforesaid and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof the said Joshua Morton  
& Matilda his wife both hereby acknowledge him of his the said Joshua Morton & Matilda  
his wife both as joint bargainer of sell, alien? enfeoff? and confirm? and by these presents  
for him & herself, their heirs & assigns, do grant, bargain and sell alien? enfeoff? & confirm?  
unto the said William Pona his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract of land  
containing by estimation thirty acres more or less lying and being in the County of Southampton  
beginning at a black gum a corner tree in the said Mortons line from thence the said William  
Pona has to Browns Road from thence along the said Road to a ligh wood post from thence  
to a postmark tree there to the said gum at the beginning, and the severities of neither
