Witnesseth that the said Joshua Noton & Matilda his Wife for and in consideration of the sum of fifty five dollars in hand paid by the said William Bond at and before the making and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof the said Joshua Noton & Matilda his Wife both hereby acknowledge him & her the said Joshua Noton & Matilda his Wife both as grant bargained & sold, aliened conveyed and confirmed, and by these presents for him & herself, their heirs & assigns, do grant bargain and sell alien conveyed & confirmed into the said William Bond his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land containing by estimation thirty acres more or less lying and being in the County of Southampton beginning at a black gum a corner tree in the said Notons land from thence the said William Bond's line to Browns Road from thence along the said Road to a light wood post from thence to a persimmon tree thence to the said gum at the beginning, and the division of routes
