Whereas William Atkinson late of Southampton County & State of Virginia, died in and about the year 1816 make his last Will and testament, in which he left all his personal estate to be equally divided between his three children namely, Polly (who has since intermarried with a certain Manro Clements) William & George Atkinson, at the time the youngest arrived to twenty-one years which is now at this present time; and whereas the sale of the Chattel estate of the said deceased is now aforsaid & is about to take, and has been sold by John Dross, Jason Rowe and Benjamin Griffin; and the said Manro Clements in right of his Wife Polly, William Atkinson & George Atkinson have, and do now consent that and equal division in said sales shall now take place agreeable to the valuation of the same made by the said appraisers, and also we, as further agree to, and with each other to bind ourselves our heirs executors & administrators and do bind ourselves our heirs executors & administrators in the sum of one thousand dollars each of us to pay to the other, if we and each of us do not stand to and abide by the divisions to be made in said sales by the above named appraisers which divisions is as followeth, to wit Number one, drawn by George Atkinson say Albot valued at \$800 - fine \$600 - Hester \$175 - Dick & Child Manrova at \$475 making the sum of \$2050, which is \$8.33 cts over one third part of the valuation which he is to pay to Lot No 2, drawn by Manro Clements - Lot Number two drawn by William Atkinson, say Robt \$625 - Oliver \$500 - Miley \$400 - Moore \$450 - Penelope \$75 making \$2050 which is \$8.33 cts over his part which he is to pay to Lot No 3, drawn by Manro Clements - Lot Number three drawn by Manro Clements in right of his Wife Polly, say, Jupiter \$400 - Rana \$625 - Briggs \$700 & Kate \$300 making \$2025 and to receive from Lots No 1 & 2 the sum of \$11.97 cts which will make is equal part, and now we Manro Clements in right of his Wife Polly, William Atkinson & George Atkinson do hereby bind ourselves our heirs, executors & administrators to stand to and abide the foregoing division in the sales aforsaid and the faithful performance of the same we and each of us bind ourselves our heirs &c to pay to the other if we or either of us do intercept the other or others in the division as above.
