This Indenture made the 13th day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty six between Matthew Nicks and Patience his Wife of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part: and Thomas Newson of the aforesaid County and State of the other part. Whereas both the said Matthew Nicks and Patience his Wife for and in consideration of the sum of Eleven dollars and twenty five cents to them in hand paid by the said Thomas Newson at or before the executing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, and then the said Matthew Nicks and Patience his Wife have granted, sold, alienated and confirmed unto him the said Thomas Newson, his heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and situated on the south side of the Portsmouth and Roanoke Rail Road Company, beginning at the intersection of the south line of the land of the Portsmouth and Roanoke Rail Road Company running from Scott's in a south course on the East of the Country Road four hundred and eighty-five feet to a pine in Scott's line thence Easterly two hundred feet to a pine Post in the said Nicks land thence Northwardly four hundred and eighty-five feet to a pine post along the line of the land of the Portsmouth and Roanoke Rail Road Company two hundred feet to the first station containing by estimation two, and twenty-two hundredths of acre. To have and to hold the said granted Land and promises with all profits, conveniences and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining, to him the said Thomas Newson his heirs and assigns forever to him and his only posterity and bequeath. And we the said Matthew Nicks and Patience his Wife, set forth ourselves in his executors and administrators covenant and agree that we Matthew Nicks and Patience his Wife will warrant and forever defend the just right and title of the said tract of Land unto the said Thomas Newson his heirs and assigns forever against the lawful claims or demands of any person or persons whatsoever.
