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Stephen and Joseph Joyner also the following slaves to wit Lucy, Kelly, Dick, Annaky and
Charles with all the interest of said Matthew Joyner in and to the said granted tract of
land and premises and slaves and the future and the future increase of said slaves.
To have and to hold the aforesaid tract of land and premises with it appurtenances
together with the aforesaid slaves and their future increase unto the said Stephen
Murdough his heirs and assigns forever. Albeit trust nevertheless that the said Stephen
Murdough shall permit the said Matthew Joyner to remain in possession of the said
land and slaves hereby conveyed and enjoy the profits thereof until default on the part of
the said Matthew Joyner to settle his accounts and pay over to the said Murdough or other
such person or persons as may be legally authorized to receive the same, or until
such failure to settle or pay over or until the said Murdough shall be likely to suffer from
in consequence of his being security to the bond aforesaid payable to the said William John-
son: and then upon this further trust that the said Stephen Murdough will as soon
practicable make sale of the property herein mentioned at publick auction giving at
least thirty day notice thereof at the most places in the County having a care to sell
as much thereof as must be necessarily sold for the aforesaid purposes and selling the same first
out of the monies arising from such sale pay and satisfy all the aforesaid Guardian claims
and the necessary expenses accruing upon this trust, any surplus which may remain pay over to
the said Matthew Joyner his executors admors. or assigns. But should the said Matthew Joyner
fail to make up his accounts and pay over to the parties entitled all the money which
may be due them this Indenture to be void or else to remain in full force. In Witness
