Gray Commissioner under a Decree made the 2nd of April 1836 for purposes mentioned in said Decree and in pursuance thereof both this day granted, bargained, sold, aliened, and confirmed unto the said Clements Rochelle the Lands mentioned in said decree it being the same Lands being part of the County of Southampton and a portion of the Lands belonging to the estate of the said Clements Rochelle and which was assigned to Benjamin Rochelle by a decree of the County Court of Southampton it being lot no. 4 in said plat & report containing belonging to the estate of James Bishop and the Lands of Polly Story, for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty-four dollars 50/100 to him the said J. Gray in hand paid by the said Clements Rochelle as or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, to have and to hold the said Lands and above granted premises unto the said Rochelle his heirs & assigns against the claim of him the said Gray, Commissioner as aforesaid, and the said Gray with hereby warrant and defend unto the said Rochelle all the right title & interest in for as he can under said decree to the only proper use and behoof of said Rochelle his heirs or assigns.
