This Indenture made this tenth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty six, between Henning J. Smith and Martha his Wife of the County of Southampton in the state of Virginia of the one part, and Harrison Parker of the County and state aforesaid of the other part. Witnesseth: That the said Henning J. Smith & Martha his Wife for and in consideration of the sum of seventy five dollars to them in hand paid by the said Harrison Parker at and before the sealing and signing of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) they the said Henning J. Smith, and Martha his Wife, have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do, and each of them doth, grant bargain and sell unto the said Harrison Parker his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and marked and bounded as follows: bounded on the east side by the Moore ferry road; the West side line by that now called the "new road" or road leading from Smith's ferry to the Moore ferry road at the "oak house" and bounded on the South by the lands belonging to the heirs of the late heirs of the late Henry Crenshaw decd. (containing by a late survey seventy five acres less the same more or less) it being the same tract or parcel of land conveyed by deed of bargain and sale from Howell Smith to Nathaniel Jones and from Nathaniel Jones to the said Henning J. Smith, as well more fully appear by reference to the records of Southampton County together with all and singular the reservations and reservations, remainders and remainders, yearly and other rents issues and profits thereof, and every part and parcel thereof, its heirs and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the tenements, hereditaments and all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned, to, and every part and parcel thereof unto the said Harrison Parker his heirs & assigns, free from the claim or claims of them the said Henning J. Smith and Martha his wife, or either of them, their or either of them, and of all and every other person or persons whatsoever, shew, will and as warrant and forever defend by these presents. In witness whereof the said Henning J. Smith & Martha his wife have hereunto set their hands and seals the day and year as first above written.
