This Indenture made this first day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty five; between Benjamin Rochelle of the first part, and Clements Rochelle of the second part both of the County of Southampton, and State of Virginia: Whereas, the said Benjamin Rochelle, for and in consideration of the sum of Three hundred and four dollars, to him in hand paid by the said Clements Rochelle at or before the executing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof, is hereby acknowledged, hath given, granted, bargained and sold and by these presents, doth grant bargain, sell and convey unto him the said Clements Rochelle, his heirs and assigns forever; one certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County aforesaid, and containing by estimation, one hundred and twenty-one and a half acres: be the same more or less, being the same which was allotted the said Benjamin Rochelle, in the division of the lands of his ancestor John (John Rochelle) as will be seen by reference to the report of Commissioners, who made the division returned to Southampton Court. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land together with all and singular the premises and appurtenances therunto belonging, unto him the said Clements Rochelle, his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Benjamin Rochelle doth hereby covenant and agree to, and with the said Clements Rochelle, his heirs and assigns that he the said Benjamin Rochelle, his heirs executors and administrators, will warrant and forever defend the title to the aforesaid tract, or parcel of Land and premises unto him the said Clements Rochelle his heirs and assigns against the claim or demand of him the said Benjamin Rochelle his heirs and assigns and of all and every other person whomsoever.
