Mason and wife have granted bargained and sold and by their presents do grant bargain and sell the said tract of land, called Waterloo, with the appurtenances to him the said Lewis Harris his heirs and assigns forever. And the said John B. Mason, Trustee as aforesaid with warrant and release the right and title to the said tract of land, as conveyed to him by the said deed of Trust, against himself and all persons claiming under him. And the said Phoebe M. Myrick with warrant to the said Lewis Harris her right of dower therein against herself & all persons claiming under her. This Indenture made the 13th day of July 1836 between Maloy Pitman of the one part and Calvin Harrison and Mary his wife of the other part witnesseth that the said Calvin Harrison and Mary his wife in consideration of the sum of one hundred and 25 dollars in hand to him paid by the said Maloy Pitman as or before the writing, and delivery of these presents (the right whereof is hereby acknowledged), have bargained and sold and as by these presents bargain and sell unto said Maloy Pitman his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of land containing by estimation nearly acres be the same more or less, bounded as follows on the South side by the line of H. T. Smith south by the tract of land wherein Mrs. Pitman now lives, that by the line of Porten Smith, thence across said line to a certain sweet gum, thence a straight line to a certain pine standing on the line between C. Harrison and H. T. Smith together with all the buildings the buildings timber minerals appurtenances whatsoever to the said Maloy Pitman: to have and to hold forever the said tract or parcel of land with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular other premises herein before now named or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with
