Moore in his debt and for value to him in hand paid by the said Jesse Drury trustee aforesaid, the sum of one shilling is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold and so to have conveyed and by deed to wit 2 feather beds and furniture 1 Table 1 Spinning Wheel, 1 small table, 1 Bureau 72 chairs, 1 bedstead, 1 gun 1 cradle, 1 pair of andirons 1 pair of tongs, 1 shovel, 1 Iron pot 1 Water pail, plates, dishes, knives & forks cups and saucers, and household & kitchen furniture, 1 horse, 1 Cart and Wheels, 1 plow 2 potato hoes, 2 hatching hoes, 2 axes and plantation shovel, the present crop of corn, supposed to be thirty barrels, fodder, supposed to be fifteen hundred weight, and the sheaves, and crop of cotton supposed to be three thousand pounds, to him the said Jesse Drury trustee aforesaid: Upon Trust and upon this express condition, that should the said James Harrison neglect or refuse to pay any parts of the debts aforesaid, or any other claim which may be due from the said James Harrison to the said Samuel B. Moore the said Samuel B. Moore his heirs or assigns shall have full power and authority to direct the said Jesse Drury trustee to advertise at two or more public places in the neighbourhood for at least ten days and sell at the dwelling of said Harrison, for cash or as much thereof as may be sufficient to satisfy all debt attending the execution of this trust, and the amount which may be due on the several claims above specified, and the balances, if any, pay to the said James Harrison his heirs or assigns; and the said James Harrison doth warrant and defend the title of the said property to the said Jesse Drury his heirs or assigns, and the said Jesse Drury doth warrant and agree to perform all things lawfull to be done, which is declared to be the intent and meaning of these presents.
