tion by a due of Emancipation to the said Nancy and her subsequently born children Ricks,
to all whom it may concern that of Samuel Blant Jr. Executor of Samuel Blant for
service in pursuance of the order of the Court aforesaid and by authority thereof do by
due course, together with her children, Ricks and Nancy aforesaid, as fully and effectually
as by the said order of Court I am authorized so to do, and not otherwise. In testimony

Elizabeth Myrick, daughter of John Myrick, as aforesaid by them given to the said Eliza-
beth Myrick widow as aforesaid the receipt whereof and for the further sum of one
hundred pounds sterling, with bargain and sell, and the said Elizabeth Myrick
widow of aforesaid, with and both hereby fully bargained, covenanted and agreed unto
Joshua A. Myrick, Solomon, Augustus, Elizabeth Myrick daughter as aforesaid, all that tract of land
lying and lying on the three creeks between the lands of Doct. William Godwin on the
west, Edwin Pleysey and James Peters on the North, George Newson and the Applewhite
are on the West and Samuel Bowry and Ambrose Godwin on the south from which it is
separated by the three creeks: to have and to hold to them and their heirs forever, and
the said Elizabeth Myrick widow as aforesaid, having for a good & valuable considera-
tion, relinquished, renounced and forever quit claimed to any right or title which she hath
or may hereafter have, to the said lands, tenements, hereditaments, marshes, bogs, woods, fields, mea-
