deceased in pursuance of the order of the Court aforesaid and by authority thereof do by
this present hereby Emancipate, liberate and set free, Nancy the Complainant in the
said cause, together with her children, Richs and Nancy aforesaid, as fully and effectually
as by the said order of Court I am authorised so to do, and not otherwise: In testimony
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this nineteenth day of August one thousand
eight hundred and thirty six.
