Witnesseth that the said Levi Summersell & Martha his Wife for and in consideration of the sum of six hundred and five dollars to them in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have given, granted, bargained & sold of as by these presents give, grant, bargain & sell unto the said John Williamson & his heirs one certain tract or parcel of land, lying & being in the County of Southampton & State of Virginia, containing four hundred acres, be the same, now or hereafter known by the name of Capt. Holloman's Old Place, it being the same which he derived from the heirs of his brother Captain Holloman & bounded by the lands of John B. Holloman, John Williamson, John Williamson, John Magness, & John A. Holloman. We have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with its appurtenances unto the said John Williamson & his heirs & assigns; & the said Levi Summersell & Martha his Wife, their heirs executors or assigns the said tract or parcel of land with all its appurtenances to have the said John Williamson & his heirs & assigns shall of all forces warrant & defend.
