Drow, Justices of the Peace for the County aforesaid, in the State of Virginia, do hereby certify that Eliza Fenn, the Wife of Hawkins Fenn (parties to a certain and bearing) sale on the 4th day of January 1836 and her estate annexed, personally appeared before us in our County aforesaid, and being examined by us privately and apart from her husband, and having the said aforesaid fully explained to her, she the said Eliza Fenn acknowledged the same to be her act and deed, and declared that she had willingly signed, sealed and delivered the same, and that she wished not to retract it. Given under our hands and seals this 4th day of January 1836.

This Indenture made and entered into this 25th day of August 1836 by and between James Barnes and Sylvia Barnes his Wife of the County of Stafford in the State of North Carolina of the one part and Miles Story of the County of Southampton in the State of Virginia of the other part: this Indenture Witnesseth that the said James Barnes and Sylvia his Wife have for and in consideration of the sum of Six hundred dollars to them in hand paid by the said Miles Story at and before the making and delivery of these presents the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, bargained and sold and do hereby grant, bargain and sell all the right title interest and Estate which they have in and to a certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the said County of Southampton supposed to contain about Two hundred and fifty eight acres of Land, the north-west part where this more or less as respects this conveyance, it being the land allotted to Elizabeth Story, who was the Widow or Relict of William Deal, as her dower in and to Beals Lands, that is to say one hundred and forty four acres part thereof, the balance that is to say one hundred and fourteen acres was allotted to James Barnes in right of his Wife Sylvia whose maiden name was Sylvia Deal, said land bounded by the names of the following named persons to wit John Deal, Rebecca Deal, Zachariah Story, Ethelinda, Daughtory and Benjamin Phillips. It hence and to hold the said right title and interest in and to the said Land and every part and parcel thereof to him the said Miles Story, his heirs and assigns forever against the claim of them the said James Barnes and Sylvia Barnes his Wife, and also against the claim of any and every other person or persons whatsoever, hereby do and well warrant and forever defend the right herein hereby transferred by us the said James Barnes and Sylvia his Wife.
