our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty six, between Joseph Denow of the one part
and James Denow of the other part, all of the County of Southampton and State of Vir-
ginia. Whereas that the said Joseph Denow for and in consideration of the sum of
twelve hundred dollars unto him in hand paid by the said James Denow, the receipt where-
of the said Joseph Denow doth hereby acknowledge himself fully satisfied and paid and
of the same doth by these presents acquit the said James Denow, he the said Joseph
Denow hath granted, bargained and sold whereas excepted and confirmed and by these pre-
sents as grand bargain and sells, alien, excepted and confirms unto the said James Denow a
certain tract, plantation or parcel land containing by estimation and the old survey, few
hundred acres, to the same more or less, being and being, situated in the County and
State aforesaid and bounded as follows (viz) - on the North by the lands of Ed Davis or
the Susquehannah swamp - on the South by the lands of John Nick - on the East by
lands of Peter Crocker, one the West by the lands of the heirs of Joseph Dick and
and Peter Denow being the remainder, and all the land which the said Joseph De-
now owns in the Berlin tract, which he acquired a title from the death of his fa-
ther, from his last Will and Testament duly recorded in this County, and being part
of the land which Henry Denow purchased of Miles Vassor, Wm Griffin and the John
Johnson tract, with the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining, with
the reversion and reversions, remainder and remainders, rents issues and profits thereof, in
every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold, the said bargained premises unto
the said James Denow his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Joseph Denow for
himself his heirs and assigns, the said bargained premises, and every part and parcel
thereof with their appurtenances, clear exempt and secure from all claim or other encumbrance
whatever with the said James Denow his heirs and assigns against all and every person
or persons whatever does shall and will by these presents forever warrant and defend
