

This Indenture made the 14th day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand
 and State of Virginia of the one part, and Jane Brattle of the County of South-
 ampton the other part, May be that the said Walter G. Brattle and Mary his wife of the County and State aforesaid
 of the sum of one dollar lawful money of this Commonwealth, to them in hand paid by
 the said Jane Brattle, at or before the making and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof
 is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold unto the said Jane Brattle her heirs and assigns
 and sell unto the said Jane Brattle her heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of
 land lying and being in the County of Southampton containing one hundred and fifty acres,
 (the said Jane Brattle said) land, and bounded by the lands of Abraham Bygon, George Bay, Albert
 and the lower lands of Jane Brattle, with all and singular the appurtenances there-
 unto belonging, and the recreation and recreations, remainders and remainders, yearly and other
 rents, issues, and profits thereof and of every part and parcel thereof to have and to hold
 the said one hundred and fifty acres of land, be the same more or less with the tenements
 and all and singular other the premises before mentioned or intended to be bargained
 and sold, and every part and parcel thereof, with every of their rights, members and ap-
 purtenances unto the said Jane Brattle her heirs and assigns forever (to and for the only pro-
 fit use and behoof of her the said Jane Brattle her heirs and assigns forever). And the
 said Walter G. Brattle and Mary his wife for themselves and their heirs the said one
 hundred and fifty acres of Land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances
 before mentioned, unto the said Jane Brattle her heirs and assigns, free from the claim or
 claims of them the said Walter G. Brattle and Mary his wife, or either of them their or either
 of their heirs, and of all and every person or persons whatsoever, shall, will and do warrant
 and forever defend by these presents. In Witness whereof the said Walter G. Brattle and
