 have granted bargained sold and delivered unto the said Jas. H. Bond, as trustee the following
 property, to wit, one bed and furniture, two chests, one trunk, one sofa, seven and a half dozen shoes,
 one table, half dozen chairs, two dozen spoons, one spoon, bread box, pot rack, washing and one bed
 and one, several of Crothers were half dozen knives and forks, a pair of flat irons, meat sink,
 washing tub and Water pump together with a parcel of lumber. To have and to hold the said for
 party to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Jas. H. Bond as trustee as aforesaid, his
 heirs and assigns forever and the said Benjamin H. Travis for himself his heirs executors &c. unto
 the said Jas. H. Bond as aforesaid his heirs &c. the right and title to the said property a-
 gainst the claim of himself or against the claim or claims of any other person or persons, which
 person shall and will forever warrant and defend by their. Upon Trust nevertheless it is the
 true intent of these presents that it shall and may be lawful for the said Jas. H. Bond as trustee
 as aforesaid at any time that the said Henry Booth may think himself in danger in case

 John R. Byrgant, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold, alien, conveyed and con-
 formed unto the said John R. Byrgant and to his heirs forever, all my right title and interest whatsoever
 in a certain tract or parcels of land, lying and being in the County of Southampton and State of
 Virginia and in Saint Luke's parish containing by estimation two hundred and nine acres to the said
 more or less, of which said land I only claimed half thereof with mother's share included making my
 part or interest in said land by estimation one hundred and four & half acres with mother's share included as
