

This Indenture made and entered into this 13<sup>th</sup> day of October 1836 by  
 James H. Travis of the first part Henry Booth of the second part and Jas H. P.  
 Pond of the third part all of the County of Southampton witnesseth that whereas the  
 said Travis is justly indebted to Henry Booth for the sum of \$32.63 due for  
 a security debt paid to the estate of Henry Lenox and, and said Travis being anxious to do  
 more said Booth has in consequence of promises aforesaid, as well as for the further consideration  
 of one dollar to him the said Travis in hand and truly paid by the said Jas H. Pond as true  
 to him before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged,  
 have granted bargained sold and delivered unto the said Jas H. Pond, as trustee the following  
 property, to wit, one bed and furniture; two chests, one trunk, one sofa, some small spinning wheel,  
 one table; half dozen chairs, two iron pots, one spider, bread box, pot rack, wedges, one tool box  
 and a parcel of Crochet were half dozen knives and forks, I pair of flat irons, one sun  
 washing tub and Nelly quilt together with a general of lumber. To have and to hold the said pro-  
 perty to the only people who and behalf of him the said Jas H. Pond as trustee as aforesaid, his  
 heirs and assigns forever and the said James H. Travis for himself his heirs executors &c with  
 the said Jas H. H. Pond as aforesaid his heirs for the right and title to the said property ag-  
 gainst the claim of himself or against the claim or claims of any other person or persons, what-  
 soever shall and will forever warrant and defend by these. Upon trust nevertheless it is the  
 true intent of these presents that it shall and may be lawful for the said Jas H. Pond trustee  
 as aforesaid at any time that the said Henry Booth may think himself in danger in case  
 of being injured from said Travis to sell to the highest bidder. In witness whereof the par-

 part or interest in said land by estimation one hundred and half acres with another owner included
