in our County aforesaid and being examined by us privately and apart from her husband and being
the said parties fully explained to her, she the said Margaret P. Barrett, acknowledges the same
to be her act and deed and avers that she has willingly signed sealed and delivered the same
and that she wished not to retract it. Given under her hand and seal this 26th day of
July 1836.

This Indenture was proved by the oath of Jacob Barrett & William Boon, witnesses thereto,
as to John Barrett, and the same having been proved, as to him, in the office, on the 15th day
of August 1836 by the oath of Alexander Myrick a Notary Thereto, was, together with the certificate
annexed of the prior examination and acknowledgment of Margaret P. Barrett his wife, admitted
to record. And at a Court held for the County aforesaid the 21st day of November 1836 the said
indenture was entered upon the proceedings of the day.

This Indenture made and entered into on the 16th day of May in the year of our Lord
Eighteen hundred and Sixty six between Sampson L. Rose and Mary Rose his wife of the County
of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Weston Pope of the same County & State
of the other part witnesseth that the said Sampson L. Rose and Mary his wife for and in considera-
tion of the sum of Twenty dollars Current Money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid
by the said Weston Pope at or before the recording and delivery of these presents, the right
whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents intend
each of them with hereby grant bargain and sell unto him the said Weston Pope his heirs and
affigis forever one certain tract or parcel of land, situate, lying and being in the aforesaid County
of Southampton and parish of Saint Lukes, containing by a late survey Twenty acres (to the
best, more or less) and bounded as follows, to wit, beginning at a maple standing in a small branch
a corner in said Sampson Rose's line, thence along the road, a new line Nottoway E 47 1/2 poles
thence S 77 1/2 E 16 poles thence S 80 E 28 1/2 poles to a post a due corner for said Sampson
Rose in Weston Pope's line, thence along the said Weston Pope's line S 25 W 7 poles to a post
a corner thence S 47 1/2 E 9 poles to a white oak standing near a small branch, a corner for Weston
Pope, thence down the run of said small branch to the first branch, thence up the run thereof
to the beginning. It have and to hold the above described tract or parcel of land and premises
with its appurtenances unto him the said Weston Pope his heirs and affigis forever (to use for the
only proper use and behoef of him the said Weston Pope his heirs and affigis forever.) And the said
Sampson L. Rose and Mary his wife, for themselves, their heirs Executors and administrators
and assigns, to and with the said Weston Pope his heirs executors assigns and affigis, shall pay all
