This Indenture made the sixteenth day of November 1836 between Richard Stewart of the County of Brunswick, of the one part, and Jacob Williams of the County of Southampton, of the other part: Witnesseth, that the said Richard Stewart for and in consideration of the sum of Twelve hundred dollars, lawful money, to him the said Richard Stewart, by the said Jacob Williams granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents with grant bargain & sell unto the said Jacob Williams his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Southampton, containing by estimation four hundred acres, be the same more or less, it being the tract formerly belonging to James Miller deceased and bounded as follows—beginning at a point standing in the spring of the Bridge Branch thence down the said Branch to Buckhorn Swamp—thence across the said swamp to a spine, a corner tree for Michajah Holloman & Edwin Miller—thence up the said swamp to a white oak on the north side of the said swamp to a corner for Calvin Miller and Matthew Pope—thence up the said swamp to a Miller oak a corner of the said Land—thence along a line of marker trees across the said swamp to Barrows Road, to a black oak, a corner, thence down the said road to the beginning, together with all right, title and interest of and to, the said above mentioned tract or parcel of Land and every part and parcel thereof, unto the said Jacob Williams his heirs & assigns forever. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Jacob Williams his heirs and assigns forever. This Indenture made this 12th day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty six, between Briggs Korrell of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part, and William Bruce Jones of said County and State of the second part, and Samuel Drury and Trustees of the Morris of the third part: Witnesseth, that whereas the said Briggs Korrell stands justly indebted to the said Samuel Drury, by two written obligations, one bearing date 7th day Nov 1835 the other bearing date with these presents, the first name due Nov. 7. 1835 for the amount of Fifty one dollars 23/100 subject to a credit of twenty six dollars 23/100 the last name bearing date with these presents for thirty dollars also and upon for twenty three dollars 83/100—also one claim due from the said Samuel Drury for twenty seven dollars, and whereas for the further assurance and securing of the payment aforesaid, it is agreed by the said Briggs Korrell, Samuel Drury and John Morris that a con-
