

This Indenture made this 21st day of November in the year Eighteen
 hundred and thirty six between Henry Jones of the County of Southampton of the first
 part Jacob H. Duck of the County of Isle of Wight of the second part in the City
 of the County of Isle of Wight of the third part: Whereas the said Henry Jones is
 yearly indebted to the said Poly Griffins in the sum of ninety dollars to be paid on
 the 25th day of December 1837 with interest from the 10th day of November 1836
 as by a bond bearing date on the 10th day of November in the year 1836 more fully
 by affeas which debt with legal interest thereon according the said Henry Jones is well
 long and sevons to secure: Now this indenture witnesseth that for and in consideration of
 the premises, and also for the further consideration of one dollar of lawful money of Virginia to the
 sum and value of one hundred and thirty six between the said Henry Jones in hand paid by the said Jacob H. Duck at and before the sealing
 and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, he the said
 28th Feby 1837 Henry Jones doth give, grant, bargaine and sell, aliened enfeoffeth others and conformes
 and by these presents, doth give, grant, bargaine, sell, alien, enfeoff, release and conform to the said Jacob
 H. Duck his heirs and assigns forever, all that tract or parcel of land lying and being in the
 County of Southampton, in the State of Virginia containing thirty seven and half acres, to the same, more
 or less and bounded by the Lands of Samuel Borlot Jrm, William English, Job Councill and Henry
 Lawrence, also the following personal property, one pitch auger, two fathoms bars and furniture, one
 cart and wheel, six head of hogs and their fatten increase, all the remainder of my household
 and kitchen furniture, all the farming utensils that is and may be found on said lands and its
 the Corn, fodder, peas, potatoes, turnips, cabbages, &c. That may be found on the said lands or made thereon
 the ensuing year 1837 with all and singular the appurtenances to the said tract or parcel of
 Land belonging or in any wise appertaining and the future increase of the stock and personal property
 by and all the estate right, title and interest of the said Henry Jones in and to the said
 granted or intended to be hereby granted tract or parcel of Land and promises with the personal
 property aforesaid: To have and to hold the said hereby granted or intended to be hereby granted
 tract or parcel of land and promises, with its appurtenances together with the personal property
 and its future increase hereby conveyed unto to said Jacob H. Duck his heirs Executors administrators
 and assigns forever, And the said Henry Jones for himself his heirs Executors and assigns, doth hereby
 covenant promise and agree to and with the said Jacob H. Duck his heirs Executors administrators
 forever in manner and form following: That is to say that the said Henry Jones his heirs Executors
 and assigns, the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and promises with their appurtenances together with
 all the personal property hereby conveyed, hereby conveys unto the said Jacob H. Duck his
 executors and assigns, against all persons whatever shall ever make warrant and process
 against by these presents, upon trust nevertheless, that the said Jacob H. Duck his heirs
 and assigns shall permit the said Henry Jones to remain in quiet and peaceable enjoyment of
 the said tract or parcel of Land and promises with its appurtenances together with the
 personal property conveyed and take the profits thereof to his own use until such
 time as made in the payment of the said sum of ninety dollars either in the whole or in part, and
 then upon this further trust that he or his heirs Executors assigns or assigns shall use all
 due after the happening of such default of payment as he or his heirs Executors assigns or
 may think proper or the said Poly Griffins his heirs Executors or assigns shall require, and
 the said tract of Land and promises with the appurtenances together with the personal prop-
 erty hereby conveyed or such part of the hereby granted premises, as the trustee or his representative
 hereby authorized to act, shall think sufficient for the purpose, and shall take proper
