This Indenture made this 30th day of April 1833 between James B. Wellons of the first part and James Wick Trustee of the second part and John Wick creator of third part, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Witness that the said James B. Wellons for an in consideration of the sum of One dollar to him in hand paid by the said James Wick at or before the making and delivering of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged as well as the further consideration of the said James B. Wellons being justly indebted to the said John Wick in the just and full sum of fifty dollars and 25 cents due by him at this time and the said obligation to be binding for all bonds or accounts which may be justly due the said John Wick when we settle or when he is paid of from the sales of said land in good money with lawful interest thereon Witness that the said James B. Wellons is willing to secure the said John Wick, and which is the chief object of these presents, with granted bargained, sold and conveyed unto the said James Wick his heirs or assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County aforesaid, containing containing by estimation fifty-four and fourth acres by the same more or less and bounded as follows, on East by the lands of Kellor's Drury, and the North by the land of Thomas Alby and on the South by the lands of Calthrop Bond de<sup>d</sup> I convey unto the said James Wick all the right and claim in the land I got by intermarriage with my wife during her lifetime but upon this special trust and condition that the said James Wick his heirs or assigns upon being requested by the said John Wick his heirs or assigns shall make sale of the above mentioned land at public sale for the best price that can be obtained for the same any time after the 3 of April 1833 after a advertising three previous notice to the day of sale at the Courthouse door and at as many other places as the said James Wick may see fit and with the money arising from the said sales shall first pay unto the said John Wick all his just claims which he may have against the said James B. Wellons and all calls which may occur in making sales of the said tract of land then pay unto the said James B. Wellons the one fourth of any and the said James B. Wellons for himself his heirs or assigns doth warrant the receipt to the aforesaid tract of land and premises and appurtenances therewith belonging to the aforesaid tract of land unto the said James Wick his heirs or assigns for all purposes aforesaid do warrant and forever defend against any lawful claims of the said James B. Wellons or any other persons whatsoever claiming or demanding the same or any part thereof, and the said James Wick for himself his heirs or assigns do agree to make sale of the above mentioned tracts of land at any time when the said John Wick his heirs or assigns.
