This Indenture made and entered into on the 18<sup>th</sup> day of November in the year of our Lord Eight hundred and Thirty six between Henry B. Naughan of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part, and John Thorp of the same County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Henry B. Naughan for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand and Thirteen dollars, deliver money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said John Thorp at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed and confirmed unto the said John Thorp his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract or parcel of Land (situated) lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of Saint Lukes containing by a late Survey Two hundred and fifty three & one fourth acres (be the same more or less) and bounded as follows (to wit) beginning at a black gum standing in the run of Thomas' Swamp a corner for said John Thorp and Abner Stephenson thence along said John Thorps line N. 31° E. 21 poles to a white oak thence N. 48 1/2° E. 48 poles to a large post oak, thence N. 47° E. 34 poles to a pine, thence N. 44° E. 44 poles to a red oak thence N. 66 1/2° E. 28 poles to the corner of the Colfield Road, thence along the said Road S. 80° E. 12 poles thence S. 73° E. 48 poles thence S. 80° E. 28 poles to a corner for William Ridley, thence a north line between said Henry B. Naughan and John Thorp S. 11 1/2° W. 240 poles to a post, thence S. 48 1/2° W. 8 poles to a red oak, thence S. 41° W. 11 1/2 poles to a maple thence S. 43° W. 4 poles to a pine thence S. 47° W. 12 poles to a Hickory, thence S. 44 1/2° W. 20 poles to a pine, thence S. 43° W. 11 poles to a black gum standing near the run of the aforesaid Thomas Swamp thence up the run of said Swamp to the first station - Together with with all right, title interest claim or demands of it and to the above described tract or parcel of Land and premises, with its appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise appertaining. To have land to hold the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises, with all and singular its appurtenances thereto belonging, unto him the said John Thorp his heirs and assigns forever (to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said John Thorp his heirs and assigns forever). And the said Henry B. Naughan for himself, his heirs executors and administrators doth hereby covenant and agree, to and with the said John Thorp his heirs executors and assigns that he will by these presents warrant and forever defend the right and title of the aforesaid tract or parcel of land and premises and every part or parcel thereof against the claims or demands of all and every other person or persons. This Indenture made and executed this first day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty six, between Joseph Senow and Frances Senow of the one part and Jeremiah C. Battland of the other part - all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia. Witnesseth that the said Joseph Senow and Frances Senow for an consideration of the sum of six hundred and fifty dollars, unto them in hand paid by the said Jeremiah C. Battland, the receipt whereof the said Joe. Senow and Frances Senow doth hereby acknowledge themselves fully satisfied and paid, and of the same doth by these presents acquit the said Jeremiah C. Battland, they the said Joe. Senow and Frances Senow both grantee and sole aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and for a term of years to come for by these presents to grant, bargain and sell, alien, enfeoff and confirm unto the said Jeremiah C. Battland  $\frac{1}{2}$  land a certain tract or parcel of Land containing by estimation one hundred acres, to the same, forty 1837 more or less lying and being in the County aforesaid and bounded as follows - beginning at Round Hill bridge, thence the river courses down the said Round Hill Swamp to Richards Stephenson's
