Deale or other persons or persons paying the expense thereof. And the said Gilbert H. Deale, for himself his heirs, executors and assigns, covenants and agrees with the said Richard H. Redick Jr. his heirs, executors and assigns, jointly and severally, as follows, to wit, to warrant and defend the aforesaid named negroes lawfully conveyed unto the said Richard H. Redick his heirs, executors, and assigns, against the claims or demands, or in manner of all and every person or persons whatsoever, to be shown up to the said Richard H. Redick Jr. his executors or assigns the possession of the said slaves when required by virtue of the requisites of this Indenture, to take care and proper care of the aforesaid slaves whilst the same shall remain in the possession of the said Gilbert H. Deale or any other person holding under him, and lastly to save the said Richard H. Redick Jr. harmless, from being damaged or from sustaining any loss or inconveniences, by will and faith, fully executing the powers and trust herein created and given them. This Indenture, made the 26th day of Novr. in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty seven between Anselm Denson and Sally his Wife of the one part and Nicholas S. Right of the other part, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia: Witnesseth: That the said Anselm Denson and Sally his Wife, in consideration of Two hundred and fifty dollars of lawful money of the Commonwealth, to them in hand paid by the said Nicholas S. Right at & before the making and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have bargained and sold, and by these presents do, and each of them doth, bargain and sell unto the said Nicholas S. Right his heirs and assigns, a certain tract or parcel of Land lying in the County of Southampton and situated on the South side of Swack Swamp and bounded in the following manner, on the North by the name Smithfield Road leading from Smithfield to Jerusalem, on the East by the lands belonging to the heirs of Harrison Stephenson decd. and Swack Swamp, and on the West by the lands belonging to Jesse Branch (for containing) one hundred and five acres be the same, more or less, together all the lands, Tenements, emblements hereditaments, and appurtenances whatsoever, and the reversion and reversions, remainders and remainders yearly and other rents, issues and profits thereof and of every part and parcel thereof: To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land, with the Tenements, hereditaments and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold, and every part and parcel thereof, with every of their rights members and appurtenances unto the said Nicholas S. Right his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Anselm Denson and Sally his Wife, for themselves and their heirs the said Land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Nicholas S. Right his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims of theirs, the said Anselm Denson and Sally his Wife, or either of them their or either of their heirs, and of all and every person or persons whatsoever, shall well and do warrant and lawfully defend by these presents.
