This Indenture made this 12th day of December in the year of our Lord Christ, eighteen hundred and thirty six between Robert Dewey of the one part and William A. Holden of the other part: Witnesseth that the said Robert Dewey in consideration of the sum of Five hundred & ten dollars of lawful money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said William A. Holden at or before the making and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have bargained and sold and by these presents do bargain & sell unto the said William A. Holden his heirs & assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land containing by estimation one hundred and thirteen acres, be the same more or less the said tract of Land lying & being in the County of Southampton and Parish of Nottoway and bounded as followeth: beginning at a White oak a corner tree of Burwell Branches State, thence a line of marked trees to the head of a small branch running north to Roana Hill Swamp thence up the said Swamp to a small branch running south a line between James Clappens & said lands up to the head of said Branch, thence a line of marked trees to the corner at a south course a small red oak a corner of Saml. Darvells, Jesse Bulls &c and said land thence a line of marked trees of said Bulls & Dewey, to a corner pine in Marmaduke Branches & said Dewey's land thence the run of a small branch to the beginning: together with all and singular the houses out houses, raifises, buildings, goods, gardens, orchards, ways, waters, and water courses, profits, commodities hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said lands belonging or in any wise appertaining to the same, or any part thereof To have and to hold, the said 113 acres of Lands with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging or in any ways appertaining to the same or any part or parcel thereof unto the said William A. Holden his heirs and assigns forever; to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said William A. Holden his heirs forever. And the said Robert Dewey for himself his heirs &c the said lands unto the said William A. Holden his heirs and assigns forever, with all and singular the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be sold, unto the said William A. Holden his heirs and assigns forever, free from the claims or claims of him the said Robert Dewey his heirs &c and of all and every other person or persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents. This Indenture made and entered into on this 27th day of October in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred thirty-six, between Jacob Williams, Lewis Norrell and Benjamin Lamb Commissioners appointed by a decree of the County Court of Southampton to sell the tract of Land on which Tenney Dewey now lives, which said tract of Land was sold this day by the Commissioners in pursuance of the order aforesaid and Thomas Bidley Jr. became the purchaser for the sum of one thousand two hundred & forty six dollars thirty seven & half cents. Now this Indenture therefore Witnesseth that the Commissioners aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum aforesaid, to them in hand paid (or secured to be paid) by the said Thomas Bidley Junr. at or before the making and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto him the said Thomas Bidley Junr. his heirs and assigns forever the aforesaid tract or parcel of Land (situate) lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of St. Lukes containing by a late Survey three hundred and seven acres (be the same more or less) and bounded by the lands of Henry Edgingham Amos Stephenson, Lewis Norrell, James A.
