This Indenture made and entered into this twenty-fourth day of November in the year of our Lord & by the grace of God King George the third of Great Britain and Ireland & his Britannic Majesties & others of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Colonies and Territories thereunto belonging, and of the thirtieth year of his reign, between William Norrell, James Norrell and John Bryant of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part, and Mills Norrell of the same County and State of the other part. Witnesseth that the said William Norrell, James Norrell and John Bryant for and in consideration of the sum of Six hundred & Twenty-five dollars current money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said Mills Norrell at or before the concluding and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained and sold and to these presents they and each of them, doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff and confine unto him the said Mills Norrell, his heirs and assigns forever all their right, title, interest, claim or demands of, in and to a certain tract or parcel of Land of which the said James Norrell formerly lived, situate, lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton & Parish of Saint Lukes containing by estimation of one hundred and forty four acres to the same, more or less and bounded, as follows, beginning at a sweet gum standing in the run of the said House Swamp a corner of George Williams line thence near east course to a post oak in said Williams's line thence near a North to a pine a corner of Augustus Pepe's line, thence so Pepe's line near a East course to a post oak a corner in Jacob Barnes' line thence said Barnes' line near a North East to a Hickory a corner of sd Barnes' line. Thence South to a lightwood stump a corner in James Norrell's line. Thence near a West course to small pine standing in the head of the Pona branch, thence south West course to a gum in said branch thence over the said branch to the run of sd swamp a new corner of said James Norrell's line. Thence down the run of said swamp to the beginning; together with all & singular the appurtenances belonging or in any wise appertaining to their interest in said tract or parcels of Land and premises, to have and to hold the aforesaid right, title & interest of them the said William Norrell, James Norrell and John Bryant of, in and to the said tract or parcel of Land & premises unto him the said Mills Norrell his heirs & assigns forever, to and for the only purpose and behalf of him the said Mills Norrell his heirs, executors and administrators & assigns forever. And the said William Norrell, James Norrell and John Bryant for themselves, their heirs executors and assigns do and each of them with hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Mills Norrell his heirs executors, executors and assigns, that they will by these presents warrant and forever defend all the right & title to the said hereby conveyed against the claims or demands of all and every person or persons whatsoever in witness whereof the said William Norrell, James Norrell & John Bryant have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and date first written.

Witnesseth that said Thomas Nunley and wife his wife in consideration of the sum of one hundred and forty five dollars of lawful money of this Commonwealth, to them in hand paid by the said Jethro Charles at or before the concluding and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have bargained and sold and by these presents do, and each of them with, bargain and sell unto the said Jethro Charles his heirs and assigns a certain tract or parcel of Land containing seventy acres to the same more or less and bounded as follows, beginning at a pine a corner tree between James Griffin and the said Jethro Charles land and the tract, thence a straight line West to a post oak between the said Land and Sam. W. Benson thence a straight line to a red oak between Harmon Gardner and the said land and the line
