 in consideration of the sum of Six hundred & twenty-five dollars current money of Virginia, to them in hand
 paid by the said Mills Norrell at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt where-
 of is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained and sold and by these presents they and each of them, with
 grant, bargain, sell, alien, convey and confirm unto him the said Mills Norrell, his heirs and assigns forever
 all their right, title, interest, claim or demands of, in and to a certain tract or parcel of Land of which
 the said James Norrell formerly lived, situate, lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton &
 Parish of Saint Lukes containing by estimation of one hundred and fifty four acres, be the same, more
 or less and bounded as follows, beginning at a sweet gum standing in the run of the sweet House Swamp
 a corner of George Williams line thence near east course to a White oak in said Williams' line thence near
 a North to a pine a corner of Augustus Phipps line, thence so Phipps line near a East course to a
 post oak a corner in Jacob Barnes' line thence said Barnes' line near a North East to a Hickory a cor-
 ner of sa Barnes' line, thence West to a lightwood stump, a corner in James Norrell's line, thence near
 a West course to small pine standing in the head of the Pond branch, thence south West course to a gum
 in said branch thence near the said branch to the run of sa Swamp a new corner of said James
