This Indenture made and entered into this eighteenth day of November one thousand eight hundred and thirty six, between Peter Edwards of the first part and Joseph Basham of the second part both of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia: Witnesseth that the said Peter Edwards for and in consideration of the sum of fifteen hundred dollars in hand paid by the said Basham the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Edwards, hath granted, bargained and sold and by these presents with great law, full, sole and conform to the said Joseph Basham, one certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County & State aforesaid, containing four hundred acres more or less and bounded as follows, on the North by the lands belonging to the heirs of Ben. Blunt dead on the West the lands of the same and of Drury Brille and the land belonging to the estate of Ben. Edwards dead. on the south by the lands of William Alkinson and James Powell, on the East by the Lands of James Powell and the heirs of Ben. Blunt dead. it being the land that the said Peter Edwards purchased of William Edwards, Jacob Williams and Jacob Potter, with all the privileges improvements and appurtenances, thereto belonging
