Witnesseth that the said Peter Edwards for and in consideration of the sum of fifteen hundred dollars in hand paid by the said Barham the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said Edwards, hath granted, bargained and sold and by these presents with grant bargain, sell, alien and conform to the said Joseph Barham, one certain tract of land lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid, containing four hundred acres more or less and bounded as follows, on the North by the lands belonging to the heirs of Ben. Blunt and on the West the lands of the same and of Dorothy Brittle and the land belonging to the estate of Ben. Edwards and on the south by the lands of Elisha Atkinson and James Powell, on the East by the lands of James Powell and the heirs of Ben. Blunt and it being the land that the said Peter Edwards purchased of Elisha Hindman, Jacob Williams and Jacob Peter, with all the privileges improvements and appurtenances, heriot and belonging
