This Indenture made and entered into this the 27th day of December 1836 between Edwin Travis of the County of Southampton of the one part and Benjamin Griffon Sheriff of the said County of the other part. Whereas the said Edwin Travis being in custody of the said Sheriff by virtue of two executions sued out of the County Court of Southampton, one in favour of John A. Bell and the other in favour of John Nick, now being about to discharge himself from custody by taking the oath of insolvency. hath reference in a Schedule of his whole estate, which consists of one tract of Land containing about seventy three acres subject to a Deed of Trust executed by the said Edwin Travis to secure the payment of two debts due James A.D. Anderson and the said Edwin Travis is required previous to being discharged to convey to the Sheriff the aforesaid tract of Land subject to the Deed of Trust aforesaid. Now therefore this Indenture witnesseth that the said Edwin Travis in consideration of the promises aforesaid, hath given, granted, bargained & sold & by these presents doth give grant bargain & sell unto the said Benjamin Griffon Sheriff as aforesaid, the aforesaid tract of Land subject to the Deed of Trust aforesaid to him the said Benjamin Griffon Sheriff as aforesaid against the claim of him the said Edwin Travis and of all and every other person whatsoever. Whereas that the said John Caum in consideration of twelve hundred dollars lawful money of Virginia, to him in hand paid, at or before the recording and delivery of these presents, by the said William D. Hood, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged by the said John Caum, has bargained and sold and by these presents does bargain and sell unto the said William D. Hood his heirs and assigns forever, all that certain tract or parcel of Land with the appurtenances thereto belonging, situate, lying and being in the County of Southampton aforesaid containing Four hundred and seventeen acres, more or less, and bounded as follows, to wit, On the East by the lands belonging to the estate of Patrick Pond and Samuel M. Pond and Robert Caum, South by Round hill Swamp separating the tract hereby conveyed from the lands of Wilson Wollens. West by the lands of Francis P. Bell (formerly William Hicks) and lately purchased of the said Caum) and William Sperry and North by the lands of Jerry Sperry & others, together with all and singular the houses, orchards & appurtenances of every description thereto belonging, the reversions & reversions, remainder & remainders, yearly and other rents, issues and profits thereof, and every part and parcel thereof. To have and to hold the said tract or parcel of Land with the appurtenances thereto belonging, and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof unto the said William D.
