This Indenture made this 9th day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred & thirty-seven, between Nathl. J. Williams of the one part & James Jackson of the other part,
both of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia. Witnesseth that I, the said Nathl. J. Williams
hath for & in consideration of the sum of sixtene hundred & twenty-seven dollars & 50/100 to me in hand
paid, bargained & sold and by these presents do bargain sell and convey to the said James Jackson my
Mill, Measure, Peeks & also one acre of Land on the south side of the Mill. And I, the said
Williams, do warrant and assign the right of title to the said James Jackson, and binds myself my heirs
executors and assigns, &c to warrant and assign the right of title to the said Jackson his heirs and assigns
forever against the claim or claims of all and every person or persons whatsoever. In testimony

of the second part. Witnesseth that the said R. Ridley trustee afforesaid, for and in consideration of
the sum of Five Thousand five hundred & one dol. lawful money of the United States to him by the
said James Jackson in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted bargained
and sold & by these presents doth bargain, sell and convey unto the said James Jackson his heirs
& assigns, a certain tract or parcel of Land, containing by estimation 1185 acres, to the same more or less
lying and being in the County of Southampton and known by the name of the Mist Plains and bound-
ed as by reference to the old deeds will more fully appear. To have and to hold the said tract of Land
with all appurtenances thereto belonging to him the said James Jackson his heirs & assigns, to the end
perpetual use and behoof of the said James Jackson his heirs & assigns forever. And the said R. Ridley
for himself his heirs & assigns doth hereby covenant & agree to and with the said James Jackson his heirs & assigns
that he the said R. Ridley & his heirs, the tract, with its appurtenances, unto him the said James Jackson
his heirs & assigns, & against him the said R. Ridley & his heirs only, shall & will forever warrant
& defend. In witness whereof the said R. Ridley hath hereunto set his hand & affixed his seal, the
day & year aforesaid.
